OVER \$250,000 IN SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED

The Leaders For Tomorrow (LFT) Program, founded by Roger Bradley, is a result of ideas brainstormed many years ago to have a direct impact on transforming the lives of our young black male teenagers in the south suburban community. The program targeted black male youth who could benefit from mentorship from black adults who cared about themselves and their future. LFT focused on getting participants in the program to enhance themselves by becoming better academic students and future leaders of society. The male students who participated would be more engaged with leadership roles in their schools and community—becoming active in various clubs/activities such as the Chess Club, Science Club, Honors Roll, Class Leaders, etc. Our students would be more conscious of their manners, behavior, actions, and future possibilities. With the guidance of the men from TMLCF and TML, we would challenge them and have them in a safe and nurturing environment where they could grow, learn, and evolve into strongminded black males. Embracing education and our potential is a must !!!

Brother Harrison Alexander (deceased) was an energetic and thoroughly committed member of our Fraternity with an association with Governors State University (GSU), and who initiated and sustained the efforts of gathering all Alphas located in the Southern Suburbs. They held their initial informal gatherings on the campus of GSU, during which brothers shared introductions and reminisced. These sessions carried on for approximately 3 to 4 meetings and prompted them to contact National. They learned of a previous Graduate Chapter located in Joliet, IL, by the name of Theta Mu Lambda, which had gone inactive. On the advice/direction of National, the reactivation of TML would prove expedient for a South Suburban Grad chapter formation. Within due course, the question was raised regarding establishing officers, and since they were all relatively new to one another, an election seemed impractical. What followed was a request of who would be willing to fill which office. As various offices filled, the office of the President remained open, for which Brother Eugene Varnado volunteered. The following two years were a series of meetings and planning until, finally, the chapter embraced the concept and confidence of hosting the first Black and Gold Ball for the Theta Mu Lambda Chapter and established the Theta Mu Lambda Charitable Foundation (TMLCF).

Through the TMLCF, we awarded scholarships to deserving Black Youth in our region. We also adopted a group of Black Youth associated with the Jones Center in Chicago Heights, IL, in response to a plea from the Alderwoman who was concerned that the local Park District did not recruit African American boys. After some tough initial summers, under the stellar, patient, and loving leadership and coaching of Brother Anthony Mitchell, our youth went to the Youth Baseball World Series and played at Comiskey Park. I could not be prouder of the past and current membership who have shepherded our Chapter and Foundation further and higher, always Onward and Upward Toward the Light, in the name of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity Incorporated. Thank you, Brothers, for all you have done and are doing through our Theta Mu Lambda Chapter and its foundation.
